

## Comparative Analysis for 2014

The Fort Bend County Precinct 1 Constable Office patrols and delivers court related documents inside of Precinct 1 Fort Bend County. Approximately fourteen deputies are assigned to perform these duties. Two neighborhoods inside of Precinct 1 have contracted with the Precinct 1 Constable's office for supplemental patrol and traffic enforcement. Nine full time deputies are assigned to two patrol areas within Precinct 1.

Five deputies are assigned to the patrol area known as MUD 23 and 24, located in the Fresno area of Fort Bend County. This is the most active area in regards to call volume and traffic enforcement.

As of the census of 2010, there were 19,069 people living in the Fresno area. The racial composition of Fresno, Texas was Black or African American: 59.7%, White: 18.7% (Non-Hispanic Whites: 5.3%), Hispanic or Latino (of any race): 33.1%, Asian: 1.0%, Native American: 0.6%, Two or more races: 2.9%

Four deputies are assigned to the second patrol area is known as the Greatwood Subdivision. It is located adjacent to the City of Sugar Land in central Fort Bend County.

As of the census of 2010, there were 11,538 people living in the Greatwood area. The racial composition of Greatwood, Texas was White: - 8,011 (69.4%), Hispanic - 1,221 (10.6%), Asian - 1,177 (10.2%). Black - 901 (7.8%), Two or more races - 194 (1.7%) American Indian - 22 (0.2%), Other race - 12 (0.1%)

As a whole the 2010 census for all of Fort Bend County reported White, 83,307 or 58.1%, Black 28,573 or 19.9%, American Indian 711 or 0.5%, Asian 7,724 or 5.4%, Pacific Islander 43 or 0.0%, Some Other Race 19,116 or 13.3%., Two or More Races 3,945 2.8%, Hispanic Origin (Any Race) 53,278 37.1%.

There were no complaints of Racial Profiling reported in 2014.
