**RACIAL PROFILING REPORT

2014 TRAFFIC STOPS**

COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS OF DATA COLLECTED

The total number of citations issued by all ten officers in 2014 was 56. The following pages provide a breakdown of the citations issued by violation, gender, location of the stop, searches conducted (by race), basis for the searches, arrests made as a result of the stops, and race of the offenders.

Under the Tier I Reporting Data (plain white sheet), the total number of stops illustrates the breakdown, by race, of citations/warnings issued. The second page of Tier I Data provides the percentages of stops by race, as well as the number of searches conducted and arrests made for the individual races. The total numbers of traffic stops reported are close in percentages when compared with the racial / ethnic distribution percentages of the City of Lubbock, County of Lubbock and Lubbock-Cooper ISD populations (refer to highlighted sections).

The first page of Tier II Data illustrates per capita percentages by race, the reasons for searches, and the results of such searches. Tier II data also includes data regarding the locations where stops were made as well as arrest charges. The second page gives a breakdown of the citations and warning issued by charge, month, and gender.

Based upon the information provided, all traffic stops made *directly* correspond with the ethnic base of the communities which Lubbock-Cooper ISD serves. **There is no indication that any minority group (either by race, gender, or ethnicity) was stopped, searched, or arrested a disproportionate number of times.** Furthermore, **no complaints of Racial Profiling were filed by any community member against any member of the police department.**

This department has made the Racial Profiling policy available for review by the general public, as well as the complaint process for filing a Racial Profiling, or other complaint against an officer. The final included pages of this report are the policy and complaint procedures.

SUBJECT: RACIAL PROFILING PROHIBITED

**SECTION 1
PURPOSE**

The purpose of this order is to affirm the Lubbock-Cooper ISD Police Department is committed to unbiased policing in all its encounters between officers and any person. To reinforce procedures that serve to ensure public confidence and mutual trust through the provision of services in a fair and equitable fashion, and to protect our officers from unwarranted accusations of misconduct when they act within the dictates of departmental policy and the law.

**SECTION 2
POLICY**

It is the policy of this department to police in a pro-active manner and to aggressively investigate suspected violations of the law. Officers shall actively enforce State and Federal laws in a responsible and professional manner without regard to race, ethnicity, or national origin. Officers are strictly prohibited from engaging in racial profiling as defined in this policy. This policy shall be applicable to all persons, whether drivers, passengers, or pedestrians.

Officers shall conduct themselves in a dignified and respectful manner at all times when dealing with the public. Two of the fundamental rights guaranteed by both the United States and Texas constitutions are equal protection under the law and freedom from unreasonable searches and seizures by government agents. The right of all persons to be treated equally and to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures must be respected. Racial profiling is an unacceptable patrol tactic and will not be condoned.

This policy shall not preclude officers from offering assistance, such as upon observing a substance leaking from a vehicle, a flat tire, or someone who appears to be ill, lost, or confused. Nor does this policy prohibit stopping someone suspected of a crime based upon observed actions and/or information received about the person.

SECTION 3 DEFINITIONS

RACIAL PROFILING

Law enforcement action initiated based on an individual's race, ethnicity, or national origin rather than on the individual's behavior or on information identifying the individual as having engaged in criminal activity.

Racial profiling pertains to persons who are viewed as suspects, or potential suspects, of criminal behavior. The term is not relevant as it pertains to witnesses, complainants, or other citizen contacts.

The prohibition against racial profiling does not preclude the use of race, ethnicity, or national origin as factors in a detention decision. Race, ethnicity, or national origin may be legitimate factors in a detention decision when used as part of an actual description of a specific suspect for whom an officer is searching. However, detaining an individual and conducting an inquiry into that person's activities simply because of that individual's race, ethnicity, or national origin is racial profiling. Examples of racial profiling include but are not limited to the following:

1. Citing a driver who is speeding in a stream of traffic, where most other drivers are speeding, because of the cited driver's race, ethnicity, or national origin.
2. Detaining the driver of a vehicle based on the determination that a person of that race, ethnicity, or national origin is unlikely to own or possess that specific make or model of vehicle.
3. Detaining an individual based upon the determination that a person of that race, ethnicity, or national origin does not belong in a specific part of town or a specific place.

A law enforcement agency can derive two principles from the adoption of this definition of racial profiling.

1. Police may not use racial or ethnic stereotypes as factors in selecting whom to stop and search, while police may use race in conjunction with other known factors of the suspect.
2. Law enforcement officers may not use racial or ethnic stereotypes as factors in selecting whom to stop and search. Racial profiling is not relevant as it pertains to witnesses, etc.

RACE or ETHNICITY

Of a particular descent; including Caucasian, African, Hispanic, Asian, or Native American.

PEDESTRIAN STOP

An interaction between a peace officer and an individual, who is being detained for the purpose of a criminal investigation, in which the individual is not under arrest.

TRAFFIC STOP

A peace officer that initiates a motor-vehicle traffic stop on the vehicle's operator for an alleged infraction of the law, a municipal or county ordinance, or in enforcing the Texas Traffic Code.

SECTION 4 TRAINING

Officers are responsible to adhere to all Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (T.C.O.L.E.) training and the Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas (LEMIT) requirements as mandated by law.

All officers shall complete T.C.O.L.E. training and education program on racial profiling not later than the second anniversary of the date the officer is licensed under Chapter 1701 of the Texas Occupations Code, or the date the officer applies for an intermediate proficiency certificate, whichever date is earlier. A person who on September 1, 2001, held a T.C.O.L.E. intermediate, or higher, proficiency certificate, or who had held a peace officer license issued by T.C.O.L.E. for at least two years, shall complete a T.C.O.L.E. training and education program on racial profiling not later than September 1, 2003.

The chief of police, as part of the initial training and continued education for such appointment, will be required to attend the LEMIT program on racial profiling.

An individual appointed or elected as a police chief before the effective date of this Act shall complete the program on racial profiling established under Subsection (j), Section 96.641, of the Education Code, as added by this Act, not later than September 1, 2003.

SECTION 5 COMPLAINT INVESTIGATION

1. The department shall accept complaints from any person who believes he or she has been stopped or searched based on racial, ethnic, or national origin profiling. No person shall be discouraged, intimidated, or coerced from filing a complaint, nor discriminated against because he or she filed such a complaint.
2. Any employee who receives an allegation of racial profiling, including the officer who initiated the stop, shall record the person's name, address, and telephone number, and forward the complaint through the appropriate channel or direct the individual(s).

Any employee contacted shall provide to that person a copy of a complaint form or the department process for filing a complaint. All employees will report any allegation of racial profiling to their superior before the end of their shift.

1. Investigation of a complaint shall be conducted in a thorough and timely manner. All complaints will be acknowledged in writing to the initiator, who will receive a disposition regarding said complaint within a reasonable period of time. The investigation shall be reduced to writing and any reviewer's comments or conclusions shall be filed with the chief. When applicable, findings and/or suggestions for disciplinary action, retraining, or changes in policy shall be filed with the chief.
2. If a racial profiling complaint is sustained against an officer, it will result in appropriate corrective and/or disciplinary action, up to and including termination.
3. Upon commencement of an investigation by this department into the complaint, and a written request is made by the officer (the subject of the complaint), this department shall promptly provide a copy of the recording to that officer, if there is a departmental video or audio recording of the events upon which a complaint of racial profiling is based.

SECTION 6 PUBLIC EDUCATION

This department will inform the public of its policy against racial profiling and the complaint process. Methods that may be utilized to inform the public are monthly Superintendent's/campus newsletters, PTA meetings, the Internet, as well as governing board meetings. Additionally, information will be made available as appropriate in languages other than English.

SECTION 7 CITATION DATA COLLECTION & REPORTING

An officer is required to collect information relating to traffic stops in which a citation is issued. On the citation officers must include: See Appendix – C

1. The violator's race or ethnicity;
2. Whether the race of the offender was known by the officer prior to the stop;
3. Whether a search was conducted;
4. Was the search consensual; and,
5. Arrest for this cited violation or any other violation.

By March of each year, the department shall submit a report to their governing board that includes the information gathered by the citations. The report will include:

1. A breakdown of citations by race or ethnicity;
2. Number of citations that resulted in a search;
3. Number of searches that were consensual; and,
4. Number of citations that resulted in custodial arrest for this cited violation or any other violation

Not later than March 1st of each year, this department shall submit a report to our governing body containing this information from the preceding calendar year.

SECTION 8 COLLECTION AND REPORTING INFORMATION GATHERED FROM TRAFFIC AND PEDESTRIAN STOPS

An officer who stops a motor vehicle for an alleged violation of a law or ordinance regulating traffic, or who stops a pedestrian for any suspected offense, shall record and report the following information:

1. A physical description of each person detained as a result of the stop, including:
 - a) The person's gender;
 - b) The person's race or ethnicity, as stated by the person or as determined by the officer to the best of his/her ability.

2. The approximate location of the stop or street address. The suspected offense or the traffic law or ordinance alleged to have been violated.
3. Whether the officer conducted a search as a result of the stop and, if so, whether the person detained consented to the search.
4. Whether probable cause to search existed and, if so, the fact(s) supporting the existence of that probable cause.
5. Whether any contraband was discovered in the course of the search and, if so, the type of contraband discovered.
6. Whether the officer made an arrest as a result of the stop and/or search and, if so a statement of the offense charged.
7. Whether the officer issued a warning or a citation as a result of the stop and, if so, a statement of the offense charged.

This department shall compile and analyze the information contained in these individual reports. Not later than March 1st of each year, this department shall submit, a report to TCOLE and the governing body containing the information compiled from the preceding calendar year in a manner they approve. This report will include:

1. A comparative analysis of the information contained in the individual reports in order to:
 - a) Determine the prevalence of racial profiling by officers in this department; and,
 - b) Examine the disposition of traffic and pedestrian stops made by this department's officers, including searches resulting from stops.
2. Information relating to each complaint filed with this department alleging racial profiling.

This report will not include identifying information about a peace officer that makes a stop or about an individual who is stopped or arrested by a peace officer.
